As you will see, 2024 has been a year of remarkable growth and success for Seminole County TNVR (SCTNVR) thanks to people like you! We've served a record number of cats and kittens, and the number of SCTNVR volunteers has jumped from 15 to 27 to meet increasing demand for our services. This is just one more example of our work and collaboration to champion the humane treatment of all cats and kittens.




A HELPFUL TIP FROM OUR PARTNER —


